**APPENDIX R - DoD CONTRACTS**

**REPAIR PARTS**

**I. MECHANICAL/ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS**

When the purchase order item specifies -

"Outfit of onboard repair parts and special tools in accordance with Appendix R,"

Onboard repair parts will be required as determined by the Navy's approval action of the Provisioning Technical Documentation described in Appendix F and incremental stock number sequence listings furnished by the Navy.

When onboard repair parts are required, they will either be itemized in the purchase order, added by a modification to the order or by a separate order. This itemization is your authorization to manufacture and/or otherwise procure the parts. UNLESS SPECIFICALLY AUTHORIZED TO DO SO BY THIS COMPANY, NO REPAIR PARTS OR SPECIAL TOOLS SHALL BE SHIPPED UNTIL SUCH PARTS AND/OR TOOLS ARE ITEMIZED IN AN ORDER.

When onboard repair parts for the equipment can be supplied from alternate suppliers, please notify this Company by letter listing each part with the name and address of its alternate supplier.

For mechanical/electrical equipment, Navy stock repair parts and stock components are not required to be furnished under this contract. However, stock repair parts and/or stock components may be selected by the Inventory Control Point for Navy purchase from those items covered by the provisioning technical documentation.

By acceptance of this order, the vendor agrees to enter a standard Government contract, or purchase order from the Naval Sea Systems Command or the Navy Inventory Control Point, or a purchase order from this Company for such stock repair parts and stock components as the Government desires to purchase, provided such a contract is received not later than 120 days after complete provisioning technical documentation has been received at the Inventory Control Point in accordance with Paragraph 6.3.1.3 of Military Specification MIL-P-15137C, Amendment 2, and provided further that the parties reach an agreement on price and delivery.

**II. ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS**

When the purchase order specifies --

"Outfit of onboard repair parts and special tools in accordance with Appendix R."

Onboard repair parts will be required for the subject equipment/component as determined by the Navy's action on the provisioning document described in Appendix F and Incremental stock number sequence listings furnished by the Navy.

When onboard repair parts are required, they will either be itemized in the purchase order, added by a modification to the order or by a separate order. This itemization is your authorization to manufacture and/or otherwise procure the parts. UNLESS SPECIFICALLY AUTHORIZED TO DO SO BY THIS COMPANY, NO REPAIR PARTS OR SPECIAL TOOLS SHALL BE SHIPPED UNTIL SUCH PARTS AND/OR TOOLS ARE ITEMIZED IN AN ORDER.

By acceptance of this order, the vendor agrees to accept a standard Government contract or purchase order from the Naval Sea Systems Command or the U.S. Navy Inventory Control Point, or a purchase order from this Company for the purchase of either provisioning technical documentation, onboard repair parts/stock repair parts, or both as the Government desires to purchase, provided that such a contract between parties relative to prices and delivery can be reached.

**III. PRESERVATION AND PACKAGING REQUIREMENTS**

Except as otherwise specified in the purchase order, onboard repair parts and/or special tools shall be preserved against corrosion, packaged and packed for domestic shipment and storage, consistent with good commercial practice, so as to insure that all parts will be received at these works, undamaged and in a dry, clean condition suitable for installation in the parent equipment.

Parts should be individually packaged except when used in sets or quantities greater than one.

Specification MIL-P-116H with Amendment No. 1 shall be used as a guide for preserving and packaging onboard repair parts.

Onboard repair parts shall be individually identified in accordance with MIL-STD-129J.

Repair boxes where required shall comply with MIL-B-233C, Admendment 1.

Special requirements for oxygen and nitrogen parts:

- a. Cleaning and drying procedures shall be as outlined in NAVSHIP Instructions 9230.7A and 9230.12A as applicable.
- b. No preservatives of any type shall be applied to any item.
- c. Parts should be packaged in transparent bags conforming to MIL-B-22205 type I or II. A single thickness of film for items up to 10 lbs. and at least two thicknesses of film for items 10 lbs. or over. Bag closures should be made by heat sealing.
- d. All packages shall have a green colored, warning label, color No. 14167 or Federal Std. No. 595, and shall be marked with the following information:

1. WARNING THIS PART CLEANED FOR OXYGEN-NITROGEN SYSTEMS. DO NOT OPEN UNTIL READY FOR USE.

2. Federal Stock No., if known.

3. Quantity and Unit.

4. Contract and Purchase Order No.

5. Markings shall be in black.

#### I. SHIPPING REQUIREMENTS

When making shipment of onboard repair parts, the following conditions apply:

- a. Partial shipment permitted.
- b. Shipment permitted without Federal Stock Numbers, provided the numbers are not available at the shipping date.
- c. Shipment should be made concurrently with the parent equipment/component.
